Hurricane Irma Report

The summer has come and gone and the condo was doing so well completing projects and repairs.

Then along came Irma and we experienced damage to our property. But the complex was quite lucky in that most of the damage was cosmetic, although some water intrusion was noted in various units.

At this time, stop gap measures [tarps on roofs and cupolas] are being taken to prevent further damage. Bids are being obtained to prepare to repair/replace damaged areas. Soffit companies, eave companies, roofing companies and various repair people are on the grounds estimating the repair costs.

Your Board of Directors will award bids to companies and work will start when the company is chosen.

Many residents helped with the immediate clean-up the morning after the storm and we thank those residents. Our maintenance team led by Joe Sinnott worked very hard in the days following the storm. Also, GreenLeaf went over and above helping to pick

up yard debris and building parts that had blown off. The grounds looked good within a very few short days of the storm. Yes, we still have a long ways to go but this condo community should take pride in coming together and wanting the best for all.
